#### Dear Epiphany,

On Father's Day- June 18th I began a four-week sermon series on the topic of "Anger." Why would I do that? The answer is simple- there is too much anger and hatred in our world and community today. While there was anger and hatred prior to the Covid-19 pandemic, it appears to me that anger continues to be on a uprise and we need to do something about it. The amount of "grace" and "forgiveness" shown to others seems to lessen each day. When a person shows kindness to another person it is almost an exception instead of the norm. Do we really care for each other?

The word "anger" and its various forms is used over 250 times in the Bible, depending upon which translation of the Bible you are using. Most of them are used to describe the emotion God has towards the Israelites in the Old Testament. Why? I think it is to help make God more realistic to the Israelites. To help point out the kind of relationship God wants to have with Israel and each of us.

We find ourselves in a unique and difficult situation. We are a part of the world in which we live. Our emotions, fear, frustration, and anger are all on the uprise. Since we are on edge, everything that a person does that is not to our liking will cause us to be more angered. It is literally a waterfall of our emotions, and they keep increasing.

We are called out by our Baptism to be different. In Ephesians 4:29-32 we read, "Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were marked with a seal for the day of redemption. Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you (NRSV).

Each week, it is my intention in this sermon series, to look at our emotions, specifically anger, and try to find ways for us to live a more Biblical Life. We are not going to change the world overnight, but we can change it one person at a time. Join us in

this discussion and let us learn together.



#### President letter to Congregation

June 3, 2023

Greetings to members of our Epiphany Family. I hope and pray that this short message finds everyone in good spirits. On Sunday May 21st we held our Annual Congregational meeting along with a fabulous breakfast. I want to thank all who attended and those great fellowship people who made the meeting a success. We had 31 voting members present and adopted a new Budget for the 2023-24 church year that begins in July. We take very seriously the financial responsibility to operate this Congregation in a transparent and within our adopted budget. This new budget is just a 1% increase over last year's guideline. This in itself is nothing short of a miracle with today's climate of increasing costs.

Even with this minimal 1% increase, this will present us a challenge. We run so tight on spending and intake that we cannot just assume that this increase will be covered. I am asking each of us to increase our giving by \$2.00 per week. That will cover the needs of our new budget. We continue to look for savings and cost cutting whenever possible. I am appealing to you for your support so that we can continue the mission we call Epiphany. We can be so proud of the various mission needs we meet everyday but we need to keep our doors open to do this important work. An increase in weekly giving of just \$2.00 can make a huge difference in the mission of God's Work here at Epiphany.

# WARNING SIGNS of Mental Illness

Diagnosing mental illness isn't a straightforward science. We can't test for it the same way we can test blood sugar levels for diabetes. Each condition has its own set of unique symptoms, though symptoms often overlap. Common signs and/or symptoms can include:

- Feeling very sad or withdrawn for more than two weeks
- Trying to harm or end one's life or making plans to do so
- Severe, out-of-control, risk-taking behavior that causes harm to self or others
- Sudden overwhelming fear for no reason, sometimes with a racing heart, physical discomfort or difficulty breathing
- Significant weight loss or gain



- Seeing, hearing or believing things that aren't real\*
- Excessive use of alcohol or drugs
- Drastic changes in mood, behavior, personality or sleeping habits
- Extreme difficulty concentrating or staying still
- Intense worries or fears that get in the way of daily activities

"Various communities and backgrounds might view this sign differently based on their beliefs and experiences. Some people within these communities and cultures may not interpret hearing volces as unusual."
