Maundy Thursday Service Epiphany Lutheran Church

✠ IN NOMINE JESU ✠

With nightfall our Lenten observance comes to an end, and we gather with Christians around the world to celebrate the Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection. At the heart of the Maundy Thursday liturgy is Jesus' commandment to love one another. As Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, we are called to follow his example as we humbly care for one another, especially the poor and the unloved. At the Lord's table we remember Jesus' sacrifice of his life, even as we are called to offer ourselves in love for the life of the world.

EXHORTATION *(read by Pastor)*

CORPORATE CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

P: In the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen

P: Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid. Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen

PSALM 116:1-2, 12-19 (*Assistant and Congregation*)

¹I love the LORD, because he has heard my voice and my supplications.

²**Because he inclined his ear to me, therefore I will call on him as long as I live.**

¹²What shall I return to the LORD for all his bounty to me?

¹³**I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the LORD,**

¹⁴I will pay my vows to the LORD in the presence of all his people.

¹⁵**Precious in the sight of the LORD is the death of his faithful ones.**

¹⁶O LORD, I am your servant; I am your servant, the child of your serving girl. You have loosed my bonds.

¹⁷**I will offer to you a thanksgiving sacrifice and call on the name of the LORD.**

¹⁸I will pay my vows to the LORD in the presence of all his people,

¹⁹**in the courts of the house of the LORD, in your midst, O Jerusalem.**

P: Let us make confession to God.

C: Almighty God, merciful Father:

I a troubled and penitent sinner, confess to you all my sins and iniquities with which I have offended you and for which I justly deserve your punishment.

But I am sorry for them and repent of them and pray for your boundless mercy.

For the sake of the suffering and death of your Son, Jesus Christ, be gracious and merciful to me a poor sinful being, forgive my sins, and give me your Holy Spirit for the amendment of my sinful life, and bring me to life everlasting . Amen

P: Almighty God in his mercy has given his Son to die for us and for his sake forgives us all our sins. Through his Holy Spirit he cleanses us and gives us power to proclaim the mighty deeds of God who called us out of darkness into the splendor of his light. As a called and ordained minister of the Church of Christ and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

FIRST LESSON Exodus 12:1-14

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a year-old male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight.

They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs. You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the LORD.

For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt. This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

SECOND LESSON 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

**Go to dark Gethsemane, all who feel the tempter’s power.
Your Redeemer’s conflict see watch with him one bitter hour.
Turn not from his griefs away, learn from Jesus Christ to pray.**

**Follow to the judgement hall, view the Lord of life arraigned.
Oh, the wormwood and the gall! Oh, the pangs his soul sustained!
Shun not suff’ring shame, or loss, learn from him to bear the cross.**

**Calv’ry’s mournful mountain climb, there adoring at his feet.
Mark that miracle of time, God’s own sacrifice complete.
“It is finished!” hear him cry, learn from Jesus Christ to die.**

**Early hasten to the tomb where they laid his breathless clay.
All is solitude and gloom, who has taken him away?
Christ is ris’n! He meets our eyes Savior teach us so to rise.**

P: The Gospel for this Maundy Thursday is taken from the Gospel of John the 13th chapter, beginning with the 1st verse

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

GOSPEL John 13:1-17, 31b-35

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him. And during supper Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him.

He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" Jesus answered, "You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand." Peter said to him, "You will never wash my feet." Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no share with me." Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" Jesus said to him, "One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you." For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, "Not all of you are clean."

After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? You call me

Teacher and Lord--and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them.

"Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, 'Where I am going, you cannot come.' I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

P: The Gospel of the Lord.

C: **Praise to you, O Christ.**

SOLO Psalm 22 *(during the stripping of the altar)*

THE STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

*Watch as items are removed from the altar,
sit in silence and meditate on the Psalm.*

***Following the Psalm, the Pastor and worship assistants
depart from the sanctuary...
the congregation follows in silence.***

The altar is symbolic of the presence of Christ in our midst and is stripped of its paraments and ornaments to symbolize the indignities Jesus suffered at the hands of the Roman soldiers prior to His crucifixion.

After the Last Supper, less than 24 hours remained of the earthly life of our Lord Jesus Christ. Events moved rapidly: the walk to the garden, the prayer in the garden of Gethsemane, the arrival of the soldiers, the betrayal by Judas, the arrest of Jesus, the mock trial, the painful beatings, the trudge to Golgotha, and finally the execution of Jesus. As His earthly life was stripped from Him, so we strip our altar of its signs of life — this is to symbolize Jesus' purpose, His redemptive suffering, and His death for all of us.

Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will have the light of life and will never walk in darkness." The events of Golgotha snuffed out the earthly life of our Lord, the Light of the world. As Jesus' earthly life was extinguished giving way to darkness, so, too, do we extinguish the candles of our sanctuary and remove them to experience true darkness.

Our offerings are one way we serve God and others. They reflect God's greatest offering to the world and to us in sending His Son, Jesus the Christ, into our world. As the offered body of Jesus was removed from sight in burial, so now we remove our offerings.

Our worship books guide our worship life together as we sing praises to God. As Jesus suffered on the cross, our joyous hymn singing is silenced. Just as these sounds of joy are removed from our lips, so now we remove our service hymnals. Jesus offered his body and shed his blood to be given to us in the form of bread and wine in the Holy Mystery of the Eucharist. Just as Jesus was removed from us in the grave, so now we remove the elements and vessels of the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

Our altar is symbolic of a table. It is here that our Lord Jesus serves us as both host and meal at His Holy Banquet. The coverings and paraments are made of fine linen: materials appropriate for feasting with our King. Even as our King's body was stripped in crucifixion, so now we strip our altar of its coverings.

Symbolically, Christ was stripped of His power and glory, and handed over to His captors. Tonight we will hear no benediction, no postlude, no celebrative voices following worship...only the shuffle of our feet as we leave in silence.
